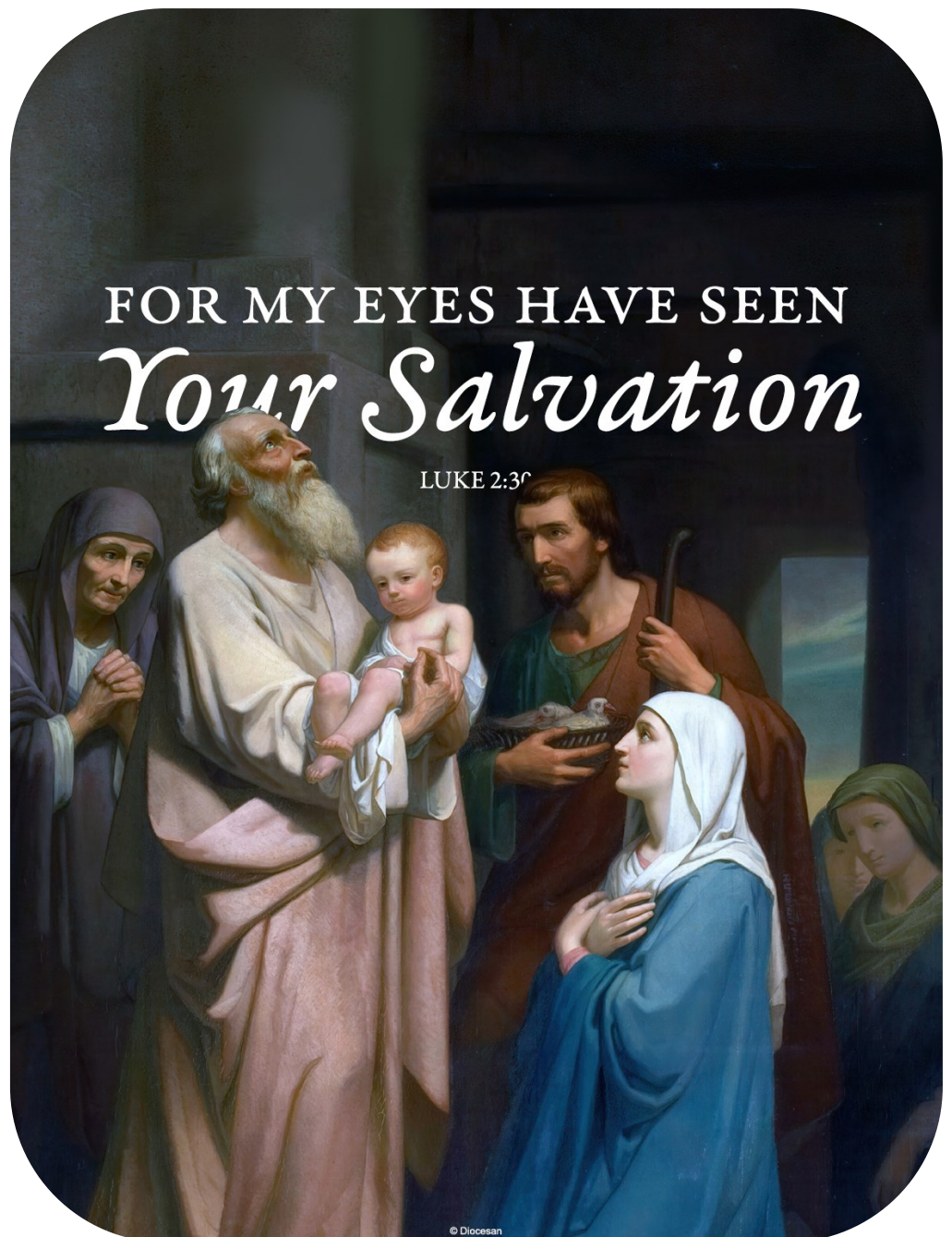

Pastor's Desk

"When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord."

Mary and Joseph were obedient to the mosaic Jewish law. Sure it would be easy for them to stay at home and not present the Child Jesus in the temple. Their religion asked them to present Jesus in the temple, so they did it. Christ asks us to go into the whole world and baptize all nations and peoples. But some Christians do not have their children baptized. Some adults are not baptized. There are many reasons for this. Maybe the parents do not agree with Catholic Church teaching. Maybe the parents and adults believe that they can find Christ outside of the Catholic Church. Maybe the parents and adults believe that they do not have to receive sacraments in order to draw close to Christ. Maybe some parents and adults are lazy. I have found that people's reasons for staying away from the Catholic Church are not well grounded. Their reasoning is lacking and they do not know the whole story about our Catholic faith. Baptism is the door that we must enter in order to be in relationship with Christ and his church.

I have found that some people are missing key ingredients in regards to the knowledge of their faith. But you and I are called to be obedient followers of Christ. The Catholic Church is Jesus's church. We offer sacraments in the Catholic Church. Whether I feel like it or not, I should always be obedient to God's commands. Mary and Joseph went with their best thinking. We should do the same.

I say this many times, "My feelings do not govern me. My feelings are up and down like a yo-yo. Right judgment governs me."

Jesus is the head and the church is the body of Christ. Jesus is the bridegroom and his bride is the church. Jesus works through the church and his sacraments. The sacraments are God's way of blessing us and giving us his grace. Why would we ever separate ourselves from the sacraments?

Exploring "The Fountain of Youth" by David Durand

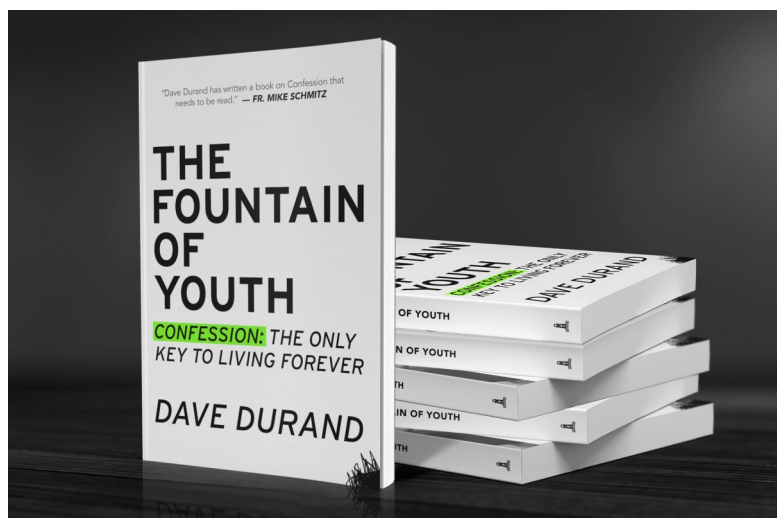

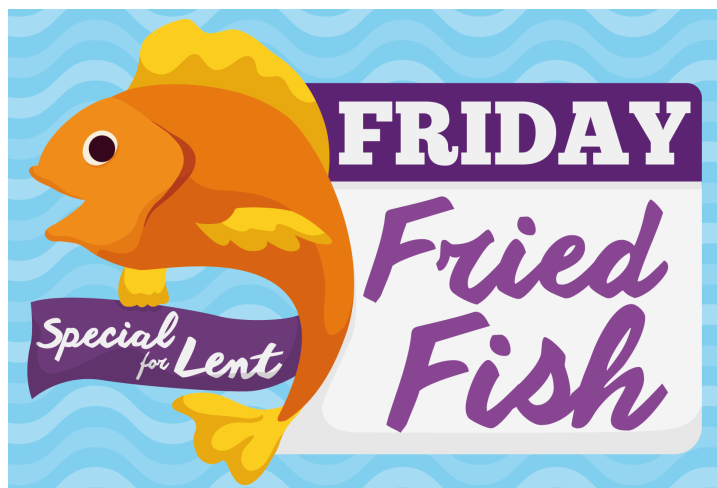

A Good Fit

Several months ago we were given a lovely, queen-size bed frame. We had no idea at the time what we were going to do with it. We don't deal much with queen beds because the SVdP store doesn't carry them, and a lot of our neighbors' apartments and homes aren't large enough to accommodate them. But sometimes we accept an item we don't have an immediate need for, and we simply trust that we'll be guided to do the right thing with it.

About a month ago, we received an urgent request for a queen bed. The neighbor calling us explained that both she and her husband were disabled and used walkers, and that the bed they currently had was "in shambles". After speaking to the neighbor, we decided this might be the perfect place for the queen frame we had in storage. . . . But now we needed a mattress. A very nice, gently-used queen mattress and box spring was spotted on Marketplace for \$50. It was a longshot, but - by the grace of God - we got it.

Our moving crew arrived in mid-December to make the delivery. But before we could move the "new" bed in, we had to get the old one out. The old mattress - which was indeed broken down and "in shambles" - had been atop two box springs on the floor in an attempt to elevate it; but it was still too low to the floor, making it hard for our neighbors to get in and out of - especially with their health issues.

After the old bed was removed, the new bed was brought in piece by piece, and our neighbors greeted each piece with great joy. As it was assembled, the husband beamed, quietly murmuring "thank you, Jesus" over and over. He marveled at the height of the new bed and the tall, sturdy frame - grateful that this bed would be so much easier for him and his wife to navigate. We made up the bed with sheets and a comforter from our stash and brand new pillows. As we left, we were convinced that the lovely queen frame was where it was meant to be.

This Quarter by the Numbers

During the months of October through December, we assisted our neighbors in need with:

- \$6637.00 in rental assistance to keep 39 families in their homes
- \$6002.95 in utility assistance to keep 54 families' electricity, gas & water on
- \$3678.27 in furniture and appliance assistance to improve our neighbors' quality of life; our moving crew made deliveries to 33 households
- We also provided food to 198 people from 109 households, and we made 26 food deliveries to those who were unable to physically come to our pantry.
